## **Bronfenbrenners Ecological Systems Theory**

Bronfenbrenners Ecological Systems Theory identifies four different systems in a child's environment, each of which have an effect on a child's development. These systems are:

- **Microsystem** the imediate surroundings and things which affect the child, such as the family or classroom
- Mesosytem which is two microsystems in interaction
- Exosystem an outside environment which indirectly affects the child, such as a siblings classroom
- Macrosystem the community

The digram above outlines the four system and gives examples of what fits into each.

## **Importance to Grandparents**

Grandparents influence children in all four of their systems. They can be part of their Microsystem and they can <u>directly influence</u> them, their microsystems form the childs Exosystem because what happens to them <u>indirectly influences</u> the child and they are part of the community so the child sees what they do and these<u>symbolicly influences</u> them. How grandparents influence children is the key point to our research so Bronfenbrenners Ecological Systems Theory is very important to our topic.
